Continuing her Community Connections crochet series for both beginner and intermediate crafters, Moorefield's Karen Coby will present a four-session "Scraps Class" workshop in Moorefield. Starting March 3, the class will meet Monday evenings from 6:00-8:00 pm at Eastern WV Community and Technical College's center in the HARCO Complex, one-half mile east of town.

"We'll use small amounts of yarn to make several different projects," Coby said, including refrigerator magnet decorations such as butterflies, Oreo cookies, and pins for St. Patrick's Day and Easter. "And we'll make bookworms to use to mark your place in a book, and hair scrunchies, and a kitty notepad that holds a pencil and notepad to place by your telephone."

Coby will supply all the scrap yarn necessary for the projects, and asks that participants bring their own crochet needles. "We're going to have lots and lots of fun," said Coby, who has refined her skills over more than three decades of crocheting. "And I might just throw some surprises in there."
